Subject: Submission of proposal for levy of Power Purchase Cost Adjustment Charges (PPAC) pertaining to Q1 of FY 2021-22.

Dear Sir.

This is with reference to the directions contained in the DERC (Business Plan) Regulations, 2019 notified by the Hon'ble Commission, towards levy of Power Purchase Adjustment Charges; excerpt of the relevant clauses are reproduced below:

Clause 30 (4)(a)

"in case PPAC does not exceed 5% for any quarter, the Distribution Licensee may levy PPAC at 90% of computed PPAC with prior intimation to the Commission without going through the regulatory proceedings."

Clause 30 (5)

"The Distribution Licensee shall upload the computation of PPAC on its website before the same is levied in the consumers' electricity bills."

Based on the audited accounts for the period Quarter 1 (April 2021 to June 2021) of FY 2021-22, we have calculated the PPAC applicable in line with the PPAC methodology specified by the Hon'ble Commission. **Accordingly, the PPAC based on all bills works out to 1.27%** (excluding Dadri 1, since matter is subjudice before Hon'ble Delhi High Court and the same shall be considered in PPAC/True Ups upon the payments being made in line with directions of Hon'ble High Court). The calculations have been detailed in **Annexure-1** enclosed with the letter and the same is being uploaded on our website.

Accordingly, in line with the above, we shall be levying PPAC of **1.14%** from the next billing cycle due from 26th July 2021 for the next 3 months. For the balance PPAC of **0.13%** i.e. (**1.27%-1.14%**), we shall be filing the petition before the Hon'ble Commission.

We hope the Hon'ble Commission finds the above in order.
