Child Abuse: Curse to Humanity ~Mr. Shrikant Sharma

Incidents of Child Abuse not only shake our faith in humanity but also underline the fact that children in our society remain vulnerable to sexual predators, most of whom are acquaintances, despite several measures. It is this group that is the most vulnerable to sexual crimes and sadly many of them go unreported.

The Rajya Sabha last week passed the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (amendment) Bill, 2019, which provides for the death penalty for aggravated sexual assaults against children and will set up 1023 fast track courts, particularly to be made for dispensing cases which are pending under POSO act, it is expected to see drastic dip in the crime graph against minors.

However, it is not only the duty of lawmakers to provide safe and secure environment to children but a shared social responsibility of all citizens, social activist groups, parents and teachers. Children should be taught how to

. keep themselves safe in schools, parks, secluded spaces and among strangers.
